The invitation was, at the same time, a piece of independent social research. From it, the first significant finding was that many organisations do not have consistent communications policies, especially in relation to members of the general public (who may even be donors or possible future donors).

The second significant finding was that the first finding had - and has - important consequences for the future of democracy. This is why the Global Conversation is continuing.
